More than 250 human rights and environmental advocates and First Nation leaders will rally in Queen's Park to demand immediate, concrete action to resolve longstanding Native land rights controversies stemming from unrestrained logging and mining in the boreal forest when the legislature resumes after the October 20 election.

Following brief speeches shortly after noon, we will unfurl a 75-meter banner in the shape of an arrow reading "Native Land Rights Now" and point it at the legislature for an aerial photograph. Come lend a hand!

Several representatives from First Nations from throughout Ontario will be in attendance including Grassy Narrows, Ardoch and Kitchenuhmaykoosib Inninuwug (KI) First Nations as well as the Nishnawbe Aski Nation (NAN) political organization.
